ST JAMES' WAY



The 'Camino de Santiago is an ancient pilgrimage route, which pilgrims from different parts of Central Europe still use to venerate the Apostle James in his grave de Compostela.

The French Way is the Jacobean route par excellence. One enters Spain by Roncesvalles or Somport. This second branch has several stages to Puente la Reina. Of these, Jaca and Monreal link east to west across the Merindad of Sangüesa.

The proposed circuit allowed one to visit, in 82 kilometres, some of the Romanesque and Gothic monuments that crop up along the green major and minor roads, leading to Monreal, crossing the beautiful valleys of Izagaondoa, Elorz and Unciti in a corridor formed by the ring of the Sierra Tabar, Izco, Alaiz and Tajonar. Hiking and flying sports from the Higa of Monreal are the main sporting opportunities the route.
