THE SHELTER OF BROWN BEAR



The route of 145 kilometres to approach the region of the Pyrenean valleys of Anso and Hecho, one of the most beautiful in the Aragonese Pyrenees. The Veral and Aragón Subordán rivers, which flow into the Aragón, both rise at the top of these valleys, flowing through in impressive gorges like Biniés, Fago or the 'Boca del Infierno' (The mouth of Hell) that connects Hecho with the Oza forest.

The spectacular peaks of over 2,000 metres above sea level, populated by black pine and inhabited by the last brown bears of the peninsula, since ancient times were the route to France, first as a Roman road and as the Saint James' Way later. Through small villas of Hecho and Anso, real architectural gems where there are beautiful Romanesque parts, the presence of a deep-rooted popular culture can be seen in the dolmens and scattered cromlechs of the zone, old bridges, sturdy mills, country refuges and hermitages, as well as the persistence of mountain customs and traditions.
